

getting to tetiaroa

The private atoll of Tetiaroa is part of the Windward Islands in the Society Archipelago and is located about 60 kilometers/30 miles north of Tahiti. Air Tetiaroa operates the spectacular 20-minute flight from Tahiti Faa'a International Airport, with a fleet of two 6-passenger Britten-Norman aircrafts and two l4-seater Twin Otters. Charter flights via Ecureuil bi-turbine helicopter are also available. Departure is from the Air Tetiaroa Terminal. Upon arrival in Tetiaroa, guests are greeted on the runway of the private airfield by a Brando representative and whisked off to their villa in comfortable electric carts.

An enchanting atoll of twelve islets

The Brando is much more than a hotel. It is the stuff of Robinson Crusoe, of the childhood desert island fantasies that most of us share. Marlon Brando made that dream his own and resolved that Tetiaroa would retain its beauty forever. Tetiaroa is alive with history and energy. Over 4 kilometers wide (2.5 miles), it comprises twelve motu (coral islands, or islets) surrounded by a splendid turquoise lagoon. The motus are a study in diversity. The Brando itself sits on the 78-hectares (193-acres) Motu Onetahi. Motu Honuea boasts superb white sand beaches; Tiaraunu, the largest motu, wears a dense mantle of coconut trees. A nursery of lemon sharks makes its home in the very north, where the three motus Tauini, Tauroa and Hiraanae are separated only by small hoa, or channels. On Oroatera you will find paradisiacal beaches and a natural watering place in the shape of a seahorse. The birds come to nest on Tahuna Iti and Tahuna Rahi, true sanctuaries. Aie is the smallest motu ; Reiono is the only islet that has preserved its primary forest. It is also the habitat of the « Kaveu, » the coconut crab. Finally, it is on Rimatu'u that the first Europeans settled, establishing a coconut plantation, a village and a landing stage

an extraordinary destiny

The Pomare family, kings of Tahiti, made Tetiaroa their private residence long before Marlon Brando fell in love with it during the filming of « Mutiny on the Bounty ». Rocked by the rhythm of a translucent lagoon, witness to mysterious rituals in its endemic forests, Tetiaroa exerts a fascination on all who visit. Even today, Polynesians still have a special respect for this island populated by vestiges of marae (temples) built by the first residents and where «spirits» wander.

Marlon Brando purchased the island of Tetiaroa in 1966. Keenly aware of the spectacular legacy he held in his hands, he wanted to pass along the experience of the island paradise to people who share his vision: to make Tetiaroa a protected site, offering luxury of an astonishing biodiversity to a handful of curious people. The alchemy of authenticity, simplicity, environmental and technical innovation and understated elegance makes The Brando an unrivalled place. This is the promise kept by the Pacific Beachcomber Group, which inaugurated The Brando on July 1, 2014.



private villas

The Brando offers 36 private villas, with one to three bedrooms, overlooking Turtle Beach and Mermaid Bay, including the private residence Teremoana on Prince Square.

Conceived by architect Pierre-Jean Picard in collaboration with designer Gilles Leborgne, all have in common the space and references to Polynesian traditions. The wooden walls and roofs covered with pandanus leaves are inspired by traditional techniques and materials. Large bay windows offer a divine view of the lush garden planted with coconut palms and «miki miki», as well as the private swimming pools and the azure blue lagoon. Nature gently insinuates herself into the sober and serene interiors. Studied comfort and purity of line reflect the refinement of the property.

Each villa has a spacious bedroom and a dressing room, a living room, media room, and a WiFi and BlueTooth connection. The bathroom offers an outdoor bathtub nestled in the heart of a tropical garden. Each roomy wooden terrace has lounge chairs, umbrellas and a freshwater shower, a covered dining area and swimming pool, all leading out onto the white sandy beach.

The 36 villas are distributed as follows:



24 One-Bedroom Villas with living room area of 96 m² (1,033 ft²), 56 m² terrace (602 ft²), and private swimming pool of 10 m² (108 ft²). They welcome up to 2 adults and 2 children under 18 years old.



6 One-Bedroom Villas Family, located on Turtle Beach, are configured with additionnal bedroom space to accommodate families with children over 12 years old.



4 Two-Bedroom Villas with living room area of 168 m² (1,808 ft²), a private garden with terrace of $206 m^2 (2,217 ft^2)$ and a swimming pool of 15 m² (161 ft²). These villas have a dining room and a kitchen for the Chef to officiate in. Capacity : up to 4 people.



l Three-Bedroom Villa on Mermaid Bay of 246 m² (2,648 ft²). It shares the same characteristics as the Two-Bedroom Villa, with a third bedroom separated from the main unit by a short walkway. Private outdoor space comprises gardens and terraces of 206 m² (2,217 ft²) and includes a swimming pool of 23 m² (248 ft²). Capacity : up to 6 persons.



l Private Residence (« Teremoana ») with three bedrooms and one staff bedroom, for a total area of 558 m² (6,006 ft²), including 279 m² (3,003 ft²) of air-conditioned interior space, and as much outdoor space with terrace and swimming pool of 23 m² (248 ft²). The Teremoana is the first of four residential villas, designed to provide an experience of unmatched exclusivity and intimacy in one of the most preserved places on the planet. Capacity: up to 6 people. The staff bedroom accommodates one adult or two children up to the age of 12.



inspired cuisine

In our three restaurants and two bars, The Brando favors intimacy to better savor excellence. A choice of vegan options is available in each restaurant.

Room service, available 24 hours a day, offers our guests a moment of privacy on their terrace or on their beach, allowing them to fully enjoy the view of the lagoon.



The Beachcomber Café offers breakfast, lunch and dinner in a relaxed beach atmosphere and with a breathtaking view on the lagoon. The menu is inspired by Polynesian, French and international cuisine. The Beachcomber Café can host up to 80 guests, including 16 guests in its shaded exterior area, and 18 guests on the beach.



Les Mutinés, the gastronomic restaurant, open only for dinner, hosts a maximum of 20 guests in an elegant venue whose shape evokes the impression of an inverted canoe. Chef Pierre Lecorne and Pastry Chef Anthony Lestriez offer refined dishes and desserts with amazing flavors. The wine cellar is world class.



Nami teppanyaki, headed by Chef Kaito Nakamura, offers a culinary voyage through the subtle and refined flavors of Japan. Two menus, as well as a selection of sake, are on offer for guests to enjoy a real Japanese experience. Dishes are prepared in front of the guests on a traditional teppanyaki cooking table. The Nami teppanyaki restaurant hosts up to 8 guests.



Bob's Bar, whose name makes tribute to Marlon Brando's longtime friend, is a funky-chic beach bar on the white sand beach next to the main swimming pool. The Bob's Bar seats up to 20 guests.



Te Manu Bar, and its small lounges suspended above the beach, offer a breathtaking view of the lagoon and the starry sky. You will be seduced by its lounge atmosphere, cozy and comfortable, with sofas and intimate spaces, some literally in the treetops. It is the perfect place to take in the sunset or enjoy a game of billiards. Te Manu Bar hosts up to 20 guests.



varua te ora polynesian spa

The Varua Te Ora Polynesian Spa is a destination in its own right where beauty and well-being, deeply rooted in Polynesian culture, are the key words. In the heart of a lush oasis of exotic plants covering 2,000 square meters (21,500 ft²), it offers the best holistic treatments inspired by Polynesian traditions. It is here, in the middle of a sanctuary of century-old pandanus, that the Fare Manu (bird's nest) treatment cabin is located. Perched in the trees 6 meters (20 feet) above the ground, and offering an amazing view of a freshwater lake covered with lotus flowers, it guarantees unforgettable memories.

Couples can come to discover the art of the traditional massage, «Taurumi». Therapeutic and spiritual, it maintains and restores internal harmony and balances relationships with others. Our facilities include areas for relaxation, energy (Fare Mana), a hammam, a fresh water cascade and an herbal tea room at the water's edge.





Activities on land and sea

The Brando offers a wide variety of activities to make each stay a succession of unexpected moments which will remain engraved in the memories. A concierge service, located at the entrance of the resort, organizes personalized itineraries for each of our guests and informs them about the activities of the atoll.



The **infinity pool** is equipped for relaxation with deck chairs, tables and parasols. Beverages and meals can be served.



Traditional activities : dance, music, weaving and other craft and cultural experiences allow guests to immerse themselves in Polynesian traditions and the history of Tetiaroa.



In naturalist-guided boat tours and excursions, guests can discover the different motu and observe the fauna and flora that inhabit the primary forest and the lagoon.



Various sports equipment are available. The lagoon can be explored by traditional outrigger canoe, kayak, paddleboard, or simply with a mask and snorkel. Scuba diving outside the reef is another option the resort offers. On land, each guest can jog in the lush vegetation or maintain a workout routine in the fitness room. It is open 24/7 and offers a wide choice of workout equipment. A tennis court and all the necessary gear are available to our guests, who can also request a partner.



The Lagoon School offers young guests from 6 to 12 years old a place to meet and relax. Children can participate in educational activities on Polynesian life and more through workshops, treasure hunts and mini-conferences prepared by Tetiaroa Society. Our younger visitors have fun while learning about our environmental efforts and the biodiversity of Tetiaroa.



The **Explorer Center** is both a place for discussion with the cultural activity leaders and naturalist guides and a library that provides books on Polynesian culture. Conferences are regularly organized there.



A HOTEL with A sustainable mindset

Wishing to preserve the atoll in its original state and wanting to set an example to the rest of the world in terms of luxury, The Brando has taken a focused approach to the entirety of design, materials and services.

We have implemented numerous innovative programs and use state-of-the-art technologies to achieve our objectives of carbon neutrality, while ensuring optimal comfort. The Brando has thus obtained LEED Platinum certification, justifying the highest possible level of effort in the construction of a low-carbon property.



The SWAC (Sea Water Air Conditioning), which draws deep sea water (930 meters / 3,000 feet below sea level) to cool the air and provide thermal comfort in all the resort's buildings, results in the reduction of energy consumption by almost 90%.

The Brando ensures reasoned use of its **freshwater resources**. Rainwater feeds swimming pools and laundries ; desalinated sea water is used in the bathrooms ; and an ingenious wastewater recycling system is used to irrigate gardens and the vegetable garden.

Along with its water conservation policy, the hotel has implemented a major waste recycling and composting program.



Solar energy, produced by 4,000 photovoltaic panels located along the runway, covers 75% of the resort's energy needs. These panels demonstrate how productive an unused space can be. Solar water heaters, meanwhile, satisfy almost all hot water needs from the hotel.

Rechargable batteries of solar energy are produced using recyclable materials. They are able to provide thousands of complete charge cycles.

Guests have **bicycles** to get around the resort, or can be driven by a team member in electric carts.



The hotel has a vegetable garden and a organic orchard, using ancestral methods to produce exceptionally high-quality fruits and vegetables despite a coral soil. This is where our Chef finds his inspiration. Thus, our restaurants offer a wonderful variety of fruits and vegetables, all grown just footsteps away: papayas, bananas, lemons, tomatoes, beans, edible flowers, lettuce, uru (breadfruit), vanilla, eggplant, zucchini, green onions, radish, basil...

The Brando proudly produces one of the best honeys from around the world, made from coconut blossoms and other species endemic to the atoll. **70 beehives** are spread over three motu and produce 1,200 kilos (2,600 lbs.) of honey per year on average. **Tetiaroa honey** is harvested regularly by the beekeeper and used to enhance our cocktails, dishes and pastries.



tetiaroa society

Tetiaroa is fringed with coconut palms, paradisiacal beaches and islets with primary forest. Populated by native species (eagle rays, parrot fish, lemon sharks, turtles and many others) and an exceptional coral reef, Tetiaroa is a natural paradise of which we must take the greatest care. To do this, Tetiaroa Society, a non-profit association dedicated to the protection and conservation of the atoll, as well as to the understanding and management of marine ecosystems, is involved in various conservation and research programs.

To make Marlon Brando's dream of a working ocean laboratory come true, the hotel hosts an ecostation dedicated to research and managed by Tetiaroa Society. The ecostation, which can accommodate a dozen researchers from around the world, includes aquariums, bookstores and, above all, a laboratory where scientists conduct research in order to protect and safeguard tropical atolls and their wildlife. For guests who want to know more and interact with scientists, the Green Tour offered by the resort stops at the ecostation. Tetiaroa Society is currently engaged in these programs :



Ocean acidification study: its goal is to study the functioning of coral reefs and ways that we can protect them from global climate change.

Monitoring green turtles: carried out in collaboration with the association Te Mana o te Moana, this operation protects green sea turtles, who come to nest on Motu Onetahi. During the egg-laying season, the guests can wake up in the wee hours of the morning (if they wish) to watch nesting activity.

Lagoon protection: repopulating the lagoon of Tetiaroa by raising and releasing fish and crustaceans that have been caught at the postlarval stage (fishing is prohibited throughout the lagoon).



Ecological restoration program of Tetiaroa: conducted with specialists in invasive species from around the world, this program aims to eradicate rats from the atoll to protect endemic species.

Mosquito population control:

an innovative project carried out with the Louis Mallardé Institute of Tahiti, which consists in releasing sterilized males on the atoll, so as to contain reproduction.



Mapping and archaeological restoration: archaeologists from French Polynesia, New Zealand and the United States are working together to preserve Tetiaroa's cultural sites.

Restoration of the village

of Rimatu'u: its goal is to bring history to life by restoring a village which was inhabited until the sixties for copra production.

All-inclusive package rates are offered starting from two nights (or five nights during festive season). Prices vary depending on the category of villa and the seasonality.

The package includes :

- A luxurious villa or private residence with direct access to the beach.
- Unlimited Internet access (WIFI) in your villa or residence, as well as throughout the resort.
- All meals in our restaurants. A selection of «Premium» products is available at an additional cost in our restaurants and bars.
- Room service in the villa 24 hours a day (a supplement of 80 Euros is applied for each order placed between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.).
- A wide selection of alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks featuring, without quantity restriction: beers, wines, spirits, champagnes ...
- A minibar replenished once a day.
- One excursion or activity per person per day of your choice from the list offered by our concierge, in shared tours.

- Treatments at Varua Te Ora Polynesian Spa:
 - A spa treatment (50 mn) for l person per day per one-bedroom villa.
 - A spa treatment (50 mn) for 2 people per day per two-bedroom villa.
