

**Little Kulala Camp
Premier Wilderness Camp**

LOCATION

- 350 km south of Windhoek.
- Entrance is situated 17 km south of Sesriem

SEASONS / CHILD POLICY

Festive season: 16 December 2010 to 06 January 2011 & 20 December 2011 to 06 January 2012

Low season: 07 January 2011 to 14 June 2011 & 01 November 2011 to 19 December 2011

High season: 15 June 2011 to 31 October 2011

Children of 6 years and older are accommodated

ACCOMMODATION

Number of units:

Eleven kulalas in total comprising:

- 7 x twin bedded kulalas (there are 4 extra beds available for children/triples)
 - 3 x double bedded kulalas
 - 1 x family kulala – accommodates four guests
 - 4 x tour leader/guides can be accommodated on a sharing basis (not the same standard as a guest unit)
- 28 guests in total can be accommodated plus tour leaders.

Accommodation details:

- Each kulala is especially adapted to the unique desert conditions, built on a platform to ensure maximum airflow.
- Thatched roof provides cool respite from the sun.
- Air conditioners ensure a comfortable temperature.
- Each room has an en-suite bathroom with inside and outside showers.
- Each room has a private veranda and plunge pool.
- A private rooftop area on top of the bathroom gives guests the opportunity of spending a night under the magnificent night sky for which bedrolls are available.
- Soaps, shampoos, body lotion, torch and insect repellents are supplied in each tent.
- Safe in each kulala.

LODGE DESCRIPTION

- The main lodge comprises a reception, lounge, bar, dining room, library, wine cellar, curio shop and veranda.
- Thatched roof.
- There is also a central, shaded swimming pool.

GAME VIEWING

A water hole in front of the main building provides the opportunity to see gemsbok (oryx), springbok, bat-eared fox, aardwolf, ostrich and jackals. Spotted hyaenas can be heard at night.

ACTIVITIES

- Nature drives into the desert in four 4x4 vehicles
- Walking Trails, including the Black Mountain Trail
- Visit to Sossusvlei and Sesriem.
- Balloon safaris at an additional cost (closed 15 January to 15 February).
- The scenic sundowner excursion is one of the best scenic safaris in the Namib.
- Private vehicles can be booked at an additional cost, subject to availability.
- Star gazing with the guides.

- Quad bikes offered at an additional cost (the quad's are housed at Kulala Wilderness Camp and the nearby Kulala Desert Lodge).
- In-room massage treatments available at an extra cost.

SUGGESTED ACTIVITY SCHEDULE

Day 1 - Arrival

16h00 - Depart on afternoon activity – sundowner / Sesriem / guided walking trail

19h00 - Dinner at the lodge

Day 2

05h00 - Wake Up

05h30 - Light breakfast is served

05h55 - Depart on Sossusvlei excursion

Full buffet brunch is served on the dunes

Return to Lodge

16h00 - Depart on afternoon activity – sundowner / Sesriem / guided walking trail

19h00 - Dinner at the Lodge

Day 3 – Departure

05h00 - Wake up (if ballooning)

05h30 - Light breakfast is served (if ballooning)

05h45 - Depart to ballooning

07h00 – Alternative wake up

08h00 – Hot breakfast

ELECTRICITY & WATER

- 220v power is available in each room 24 hours a day.
- Video battery recharging facilities are available; please bring spare battery and adaptors.
- Drinking water supplied bottled and treated water

DRINKS POLICY

Local drinks and house-wines are included but premium imports are not.

LAUNDRY POLICY

A daily laundry service is included in the nightly tariff.
