

# Kings Pool Camp Premier Wilderness Camp

## Location

- Northern Botswana
- Within the Linyanti Concession, bordered to the east by Chobe National Park.
- Overlooking the Linyanti River and Kings Pool Lagoon

# Seasons / Child Policy

Festive Season: 16 December 2010 to 06 January 2011 & 20 December 2011 to 06 January 2012

Low Season: 07 January 2011 to 31 March 2011

Shoulder Season: 01 April 2011 to 14 June 2011 & 01 Nov ember 2011 to 19 December 2011

High season: 15 June 2011 to 31 October 2011

Children of 6 years and older are accommodated however private activities need to be booked and paid for. The minimum age for walking activities is 12 years.

## Accommodation

#### Number of tents:

9 guest tents in total consisting of:

- 8 x 3/4 twin bedded tents
- Custom-made linen enables twin beds to be converted in a king sized bed on request in all tents.
- 1 king-size bedded tent with a ball-and-claw bath.
- 1 twin en-suite guide room which comprises 2 tented rooms sharing 1 bathroom (not the same standard as guest tents).

This camp sleeps up to 18 guests plus 2 tour leaders/guides.

### Tent details:

- Luxury tented rooms with thatched roof and en suite bathroom facilities.
- Rooms built on raised saligna deck with views of lagoon.
- Plunge pool at each unit.
- Sala at each unit.
- Lounge area in each unit.
- Ceiling and stand up fans in all guest tents.
- Bathroom with separate toilet, double vanity and basin, shower and a door through to pool deck with an outside shower.
- Soaps, shampoos and insect repellent are supplied in each unit.
- Safe in each unit.
- Mini bar in each unit.
- Hairdryer in each unit.
- Swarovski binoculars available for each tent on request

## **Camp Description**

- Large dining room, bar, lounge deck on stilted platforms.
- Swimming pool
- Curio shop
- Library
- Open air boma for dinner around campfire.
- Sunken hide at a waterhole near the camp.
- Every room has an exercise mat and weights (2 x 1kg and 2 x 2kg weights) for guest use



- Menu of massage treatments (at an additional cost) can be conducted in the privacy of the guest's tent.
- Cocktail reception available between DumaTau and Kings Pool (on request only for large groups taking over both camps).

#### Game Viewing

Elephant can be seen all year round but peak roughly from May till late Oct. Lion are seen regularly and it is a good area for leopard and wild dogs. Plains game is good year round but peaks in the dry months. Excellent birding especially Carmine Bee-eaters in summer and great raptors year round. Great hippo and general game viewing on the lagoon in front of camp.

#### **Activities**

- Game drives via 4 x 10-seater open 4 x 4 Land Rovers each accommodating maximum six guests, allowing all guests an outside seat (each vehicle is equipped with a tree book, a bird book, a mammal book, a pair of binoculars and Peaceful Sleep insect repellent in a centre consol on each row of seats).
- The camp has a supply of bean bags for guests to use to steady their camera while on game drive.
- Walking safaris (on request as dependant on walking guides being in camp)
- Sundowner barge trips on the Linyanti River
- Sunken hide for game viewing.
- Night Drives.
- Fishing on a catch and release basis (fishing is prohibited in Botswana in January and February for fish breeding purposes). The camp has a small stock of basic rods and reels but fly fishing equipment is to be supplied by guest if required. Kings Pool is not billed as a tigerfish destination and the species typically caught here are bream and barbel.
- As of September 2010, sleep outs are not being offered at the Kings Pool sunken hide but are possible at the DumaTau hide. A Kings Pool private vehicle must be booked and paid for, which also allows for greater flexibility re: times of departure and return. The DumaTau hide is an elevated platform, equipped with bed rolls, mosquito nets and long drop toilet. Minimum age requirement is 12 years and older.

# **Suggested Daily Activity Schedule**

The Premier camps are very flexible with meal times/venues and activity times and thus this is an indication only.

## Summer/winter

05h00/06h00 Wake up call. Light continental breakfast of cereals, tea/coffee/juices and pastries served in the dining area.

05h30/06h30 Depart on morning activity, returning to camp at approximately 10h00.

10h00/11h00 Brunch consisting of a selection of breakfast and lunch dishes.

From now until afternoon tea, guests are at leisure. The hide is available for midday activity.

16h00/15h00 Afternoon tea consisting of a selection of sweet and savoury snacks.

16h30/15h30 Afternoon game viewing activity – drinks and snacks will be served for sundowners during the course of the activity.

19h30/19h00 Return to camp (later if good game sightings).

20h00/19h30 Pre-dinner drinks and snacks served at the bar.

20h30/20h00 Three-course dinner – all courses are served at the table except on Mondays (traditional night) when the starter and dessert are served whilst the main course is buffet style.

21h30/21h00 Coffee and liqueurs served at the campfire.



## **Electricity & Water**

- Camp has 220v generator-powered electricity run in the kitchen and main areas.
- 220V inverter power is used for lighting and ceiling fans in each guest tent 24hrs/day. The hairdryer, stand up fans and mini bar run off generator power and cannot be run off the invertor system.
- 220v plugs available in each tent for the charging of batteries. Hence bring spare battery, charging unit.
- Multi-national adaptors in each tent
- Plug points are available in each tent so that sleep apnoea machines may be used.
- Electrical geysers heat the water for the rooms.

## **Drinks Policy**

All drinks are included in the nightly tariff, with the exception of premium wines and champagne, and premium liqueurs and spirits.

## **Laundry Policy**

Laundry is done on a daily basis and is inclusive in the nightly tariff.

# **Extras Payment**

Curios, imported drinks and tips/gratuities can be billed to the tent number and settled on check out. Payment can be effected by cash (US\$), travellers' cheques or the following credit cards: Visa or MasterCard.

To/from Kasane 45 minutes
Kasane to Victoria Falls 20 minutes

# **Airstrip Details**

Chobe 1 Airstrip which also services DumaTau, Savuti and Kings Pool camps Airstrip coordinates: S18.31.99, E023.39.27 1000m long, compacted calcrete.

Driving time from Kings Pool is approximately 45 minutes

Kings Pool airstrip is no longer operational at all and hence the Chobe 1 Airstrip as above is now used for all access and it is licensed for heavier aircraft such as King Air's.
